CAMPION COLLEGE

In 1999, Campion College commenced renovations to their main floor student commons area, including a new entryway with enhanced accessibility to the college building. With the creation of new residence towers adjacent to the college, the University of Regina sought to connect the residence to Campion via an underground walkway. To enable accessibility by all students, Campion installed a lift connecting the underground walkway to the main floor of the College.

Sask K of C Charitable Foundation partnered with the Regina Chapter of the Knights of Columbus in offering a major contribution to the cost of this addition to the Campion College Campus.



Sask K of C Charitable Foundation is proud to partner with K of C Councils in support of this beautiful gem located in southeast Saskatchewan.





Sask KofC Charitable Foundation Endowment Funds

The Board of Directors of the Saskatchewan K of C Charitable Foundation established an Endowment Fund strategy as a means of enabling major donors to influence and direct the allocation of income from their specific donations.

General Fund Annual earnings from the General Fund provide Grants to qualifying Charities and Catholic organizations throughout the province. The Grants are allocated through a Grants Committee of the Sask K of C Charitable Foundation Board of Directors.

Sask K of C Vocations Endowment Fund was established as a means of supporting a holistic sustainable approach to meeting the increasing need for leaders within our Church. Each year an equal contribution from the earnings of this Fund is made to each Seminarian from the Archdioceses, Dioceses and Eparchy within Saskatchewan

Brother Isidore Endowment Fund (Yorkton) will support the education and development of individuals in pursuit of a religious vocation with preference given to individuals originally from within the Yorkton trading area.

Indigenous & Non-Indigenous Relations Endowment Fund (Fr. Tonny Dizy & Fr Garry Kuntz Regina) was formed to support projects and programs designed to facilitate the communications, understanding, and reconciliation between the Indigenous & Non-Indigenous communities.

Fr. O'Leary Columbian Society Endowment Fund (Saskatoon Council 5104) generates much-needed funding & support for the less fortunate within our Christian communities.

Campion Knights Endowment Fund (Regina) was established as a means of providing an annual Bursary to a student enrolled in the University of Regina Campion College Campus. Preference is given to graduates of Mother Teresa Middle School in Regina.

Marvin & Pat DeSchryver Endowment Fund (Denzil) provides an excellent medium for funnelling their charitable donations. They wish to continue using this as a legacy for themselves and their family.

Joseph M Glasser Family Endowment Fund (Lampman) provides a legacy of Joseph's generosity and commitment in support of the Catholic faith and those less fortunate than himself.




